FOREWORD TO THE CROM SERIES

A four-book archive of the Casablanca Republic of Morocco



This volume is one of four bound records that together form the working archive of the Casablanca Republic of Morocco — a compact library kept by the Council of Private Law for its Native Moors, its officers, and its posterity.

The White Book holds the Chancellery Master Archive: the inviolable private registry of members and the sovereign records of allegiance, birth, and merit.

The Gold Book is the Moorish Education Manual: the curriculum by which nationality is restored and the Codex of Culture is transmitted from elder to student.

The Green Book is the Council of Commerce & Private Treasury: the private banking and monetary codex under which trade, tribute, and the treasury are ordered.

The Blue Book is the Official Administrative Manual: the operational infrastructure by which the Republic conducts its lawful business day to day.

Read together, these four books answer four questions in turn — who we are, how we are taught, how we exchange value, and how we govern. Read separately, each stands on its own as a working reference. In every case the contents are authoritative and are not to be edited outside the Chancellery.

I. MANDATE, PURPOSE, AND BOUNDARIES OF THE PRIVATE DOMAIN

This manual serves as the supreme operational blueprint, administrative guide, and structural code for the Casablanca Republic of Morocco (CROM) Native Moors Tribal Government.

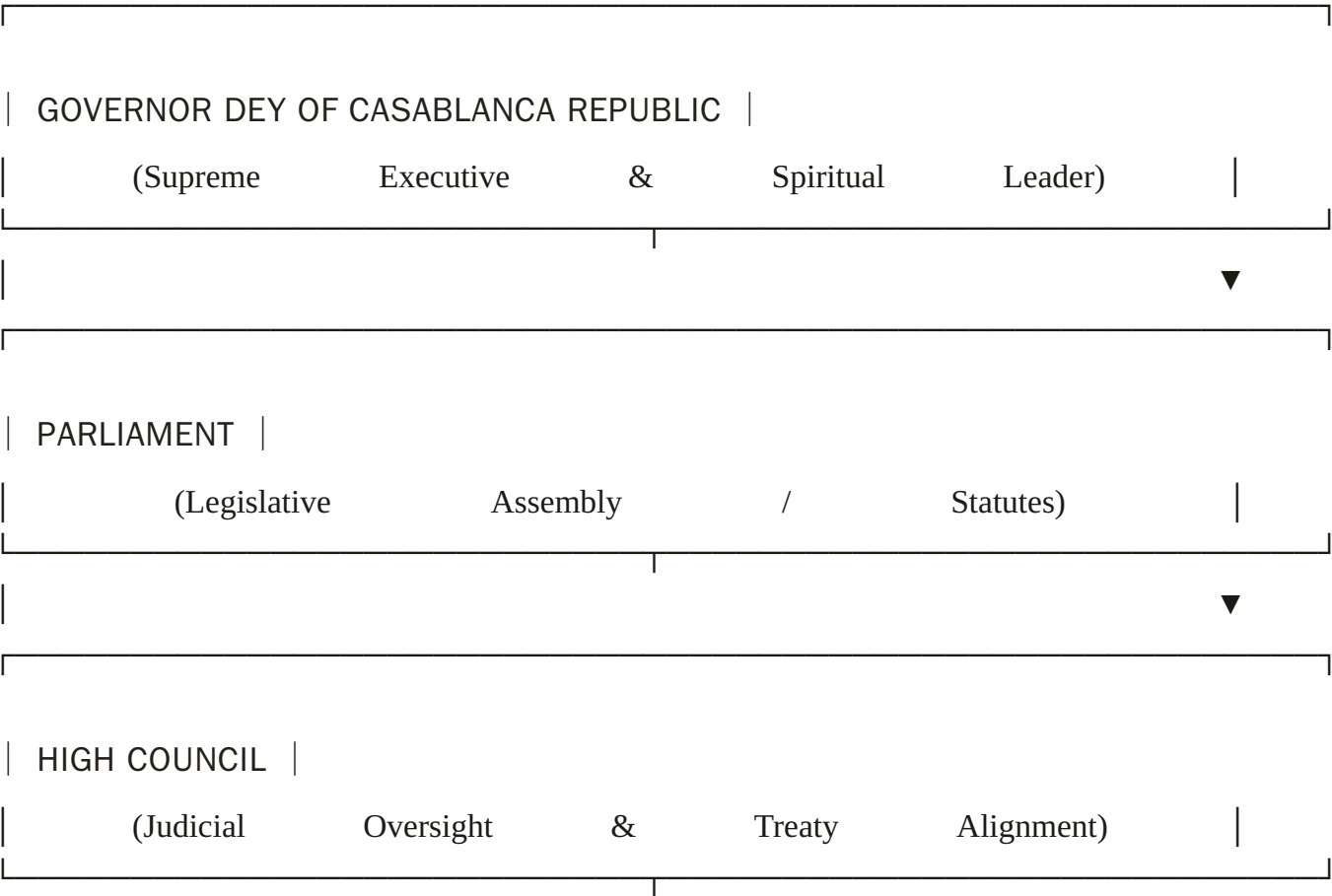
This government operates as an autonomous National Tribal Government Reconstruction and a Private Membership Association (PMA). It is established to protect the heritage, culture, families, private commerce, and absolute autonomy of its members.

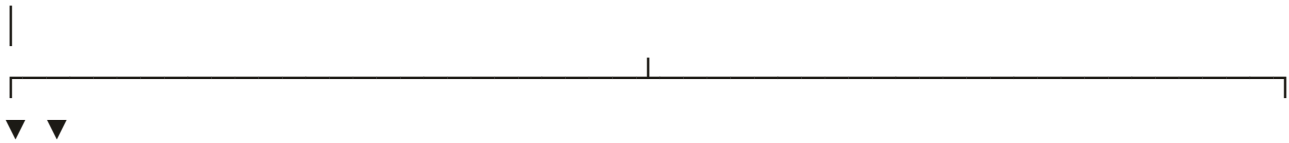
1.1 The Jurisdictional Bubble

All affairs of this government, its ministries, and its members are executed entirely within the private domain. They are protected under:

- The Contract Clause (U.S. Constitution, Article I, Section 10): Barring
- any municipal state or federal legislative impairment of private contracts.
- The Moroccan-American Treaty of Peace and Friendship (1786):
- Enforcing consular jurisdiction and commercial immunity frameworks.
- The United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples
- (UNDRIP): Explicitly Articles 3, 4, and 5, affirming the inherent right to self-determination, self-governance, and distinct independent legal and economic institutions.

III. CENTRAL ORGANIZATIONAL GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE

3.1 Governor Dey of Casablanca Republic

- Executive Capacity: The supreme executive and spiritual leader of the nation.
- Mandate: Holds final approval authority to sign parliamentary acts into private law, issue executive decrees, appoint departmental ministers, and seal international covenants.

• 3.2 Parliament

- Legislative Capacity: The supreme law-making assembly.
- Mandate: Possesses exclusive authority to draft private statutes, codify common-law ordinances, regulate internal closed-loop trade, and preserve the rights of our ancestral bloodlines.

• 3.3 High Council

- Advisory & Judicial Oversight: Composed of senior elder-scholars and

- legal advisors.
- Mandate: Advises the Governor Dey on treaty applications, ensures all
- parliamentary bills match ancient bloodline customs, and monitors the legal defenses protecting the private trust domain.
- IV. THE NINE MANDATED COUNCILS DEPARTMENTS

The daily administrative operations of the Republic are executed through nine specialized departments, which completely replace public municipal agency functions for all registered members:

1. Council of Moorish Education: Regulates and operates private ancestral academies, tribal curriculum standards, and independent student merit registries away from public municipal state education boards.
2. Council of Moorish Defense and Character: Manages internal community safety, asset defense, and coordinates the moral character standing, protocols, and field alignment of the membership.
3. Council of International Affairs: Directs multi-lateral diplomatic relations, interfaces with foreign nations, and manages electronic uploads to the United Nations indigenous rights repositories.
4. Council of Vital Statistics: Serves as the exclusive, secure repository for registering tribal births, unions, land deeds, auto profiles, and national identity records.
5. Council of Private Law: Drafts and maintains the private legal codes, trust frameworks, Private Membership Association (PMA) bylaws, and common-law contract templates defining the private domain.
6. Council of Consular Affairs: Manages diplomatic immunity assertions, passport booklet production, foreign status filings, and protection credentials for members navigating municipal zones.
7. Council of Commerce: Oversees internal barter transactions, the cPEU cryptographic token networks, the management of the Master Series LLC structure, and tribal merchant processing.
8. Council of Judicial Administration: Governs the procedural rules, case filing dockets, and record storage for the Consular Court system.
9. Council of Treasury and Endowments: Controls the physical vault assets, precious metal specie, real estate titles, and financial endowments secured under the master trust.

V. THE JUDICIAL BRANCH & FIELD LAW ENFORCEMENT

5.1 The Office of the Mufti & Deputy Muftis

The judges of the CROM Consular Court are ordained Muftis and Deputy Muftis. They hold exclusive jurisdiction over all contract disputes, internal ledger errors, and commercial enforcement actions brought within the PMA. The written judgments, orders, and search warrants issued by a Mufti are final, unappealable, and binding under common law.

5.2 The Chief Sharif & Deputy Sharif’s

The field enforcement branch of the Consular Court consists of duly commissioned Sharif’s and Deputy Sharif’s.

- Identification Protocol: Officers wear a gold-plated seven-pointed star badge, tactical field uniforms with official shoulder patches, and a traditional crimson wool fez during formal hearings and enforcement actions.
- Execution Protocol: Sharifs are authorized by a wet-ink Writ of Execution from the Mufti to locate, levy upon, and seize the physical land, bank accounts, vehicles, and surety bonds of non-compliant public officials who default on an active Commercial Lien.

VI. THE CORE FINANCIAL & ASSET STORAGE INFRASTRUCTURE

The economic sovereignty of the Casablanca Republic of Morocco is maintained through a locked, multi-tiered private financial architecture that isolates value from the public Federal Reserve system:

6.1 CROM ROYALS Private Ministry Trust

The ultimate holding vessel. It retains 100% beneficial ownership of the corporate bridge and holds physical custody of the precious metals reserves (gold and silver specie) within the non-fractional CROM Sovereign Private Repository.

6.2 CROM Holdings Series LLC (Wyoming Master)

A statutory Series LLC organized under W.S. § 17-29-211. This framework establishes separate, asset-insulated cells (Series A, B, and C) to manage commercial operations,

community infrastructure, and member housing across all 17 designated states, completely confining liabilities to their respective regional cells.

6.3 cPEU Stable Token System

The Council of Commerce operates a private, blockchain-based utility token network (cPEU Stable Tokens). This digital asset is hard-pegged to the physical gold reserves of the Trust and is restricted via smart-contract code to verified, whitelisted members of the PMA, creating a private, tax-immune barter ecosystem.

VII. COMPREHENSIVE RECYCLING & INFRASTRUCTURE SUSTAINABILITY

7.1 Localized Li-Fi Technology Networks

All tribal community centers, residential complexes, and schools utilize Li-Fi (Light Fidelity) optical data networks. By modulating visible LED light waves, data communication is physically contained inside the walls of our trust-protected structures. This architecture provides data isolation, preventing remote cellular triangulation, intercept, or sniffing by municipal communications agencies.

7.2 Aboriginal Asphalt Manufacturing

The Council of Commerce processes solid recycling waste, scrap trash, and discarded automotive tires into a highly durable, proprietary crumb-rubber aggregate known as Aboriginal Asphalt. This material is held as a strictly guarded trade secret under common-law trust protections and is used exclusively to pave independent roadways and building foundations inside our territories.

7.3 Roll Member Housing & Sanctuary Compounds

The regional series cells purchase and hold physical land tracts, immediately transferring equitable title to the parent trust via a Schedule A Recordation. These spaces provide tax-free, code-exempt housing for families listed on the active Tribal Roll, alongside Sacred Compounds reserved for traditional indigenous natural medicine, holistic therapies, and spiritual alignment.

VIII. ADMINISTRATIVE LAUNCH & FILING PROTOCOLS

To initialize this comprehensive governmental and commercial network, the Board of Trustees and individual members must execute the following filing protocols:

1. The Joint Foundation Filings (Executed by Trustees):

- o File the Articles of Organization for CROM Holdings Series LLC

with the Wyoming Secretary of State.

- o Submit Form SS-4 via fax to the IRS to secure the master umbrella EIN.

- o Mail the Master Diplomatic Stack (with the Constitutional Extract

and UNDRIP Invocation) to the United Nations (OHCHR), the U.S. Department of State, and the U.S. Department of Justice.

- o Submit Foreign LLC Registrations for the respective series cells to

the state departments of Texas, Delaware, and Florida to authorize operations across all 17 aligned territories. 2. The Individual Member Filings (Executed by Members):

- o Execute and seal the Settlers Agreement and Membership

Compact to pull their persona inside the PMA.

- o Submit the Parent's Notice of Intention to Educate to the local

municipal school superintendent via Certified Mail.

- o File a Notice of Non-Judicial Commercial Lien Cover Sheet along

with Schedule A Land Deeds at the local County Recorder's office to place their private assets and land securely into the trust domain.
